Camp 1st Regt OVI Near Chattanooga Tenn December 6th 1863

My Dear Mother

Having written you about the fight I now write for Som Cloathing I am entirley out of under cloathing and the onley way in witch to git them is by mail I would like to have two under shirts dark color and two pares of drawers Som Silk harkerchiefs and a pare of Buckskin golvvs tell Breen to send good goods the shirts and drawers dark color and som socks my health is getting [better] than it was my Regiment is at Knoxville Brother Robert came thrue all safe Som of my men have packages from home by mail they will come threw all right tell Breen to rap the things so as not to way over three pounds and the[n] you can take them to the Post office and they will tell you how many stomps to put on their is little or no news hear Bragg has run off and I think the army will be at a standstill for som time I think however our camp will be moved to Knoxville for the winter I resieved a letter from John this morning he sayes he is well I will write to him soon
